

Changes to pedestrian access Johns Hopkins Drive and Lambie Dew Drive

The NSW Government has committed \$940 million to the redevelopment of the Royal Prince Alfred (RPA) Hospital which is the most significant investment in RPA's 140-year history.

Major works to prepare the site for the future 15-storey hospital building have commenced on Lambie Dew Drive and Johns Hopkins Drive.

Changes to pedestrian access between key buildings within the RPA health precinct are required to ensure everyone's safety. Pedestrians are advised that the best access from RPA Hospital through to Sydney University is via the footpath on Johns Hopkins Drive.

The site establishment works will entail tree removal and building demolition, and will involve an increase of construction traffic along Lambie Dew Drive. A traffic control plan has been developed and there will be traffic controllers in place when appropriate to help people navigate the space.
